Begin now to get yourself into shape because when the tournament begins, you may need the stamina to play in 90° heat, walk up and down hills, and swing your clubs for up to five hours.



he seventh annual Cruze Family Golf tournament is scheduled to be held the weekend of June 24th and 25th.

This year, the tournament is expected to be hosted at the Koronis Golf Club in Paynesville, Minn. The club is well known in Central Minnesota and has been courting our business for the last few years.

The course has a good mixture of easy and difficult holes. The first nine fairways are nearly wide open, with only a few trees. The second nine, however, has many more trees and "prudence" is the operative word.

Perhaps the most scenic hole on the course is the 17th, which, although short, is very challenging. (See inset picture in center of page).

What you can't see in the picture are the many shade trees outlining the tee area. Even on the hottest day, this is a great place to slow the game down a little and just enjoy the hill-top breeze.

The 17th tee overlooks its green which is outlined on the short side by water and reeds, and on the far side by sand and many trees with low hanging branches.

Making par on this hole requires nerves of steel and all the luck you can muster.
