Although Saturday's game is not required, it's your chance to become familiar with the course, that is, find the traps, trees, water, blind shots, and observe the pin placements.

There are no "gimmies" in this tournament and you can stop swinging only after your ball is in the cup.

The winner will be presented with a traveling trophy which will have their

name engraved on it for all time <u>and</u> will receive a stylish cap with the tournament name and year on it.

A special feature of the tournament is that the player with the highest score gets to have their picture taken while presenting the trophy to the winner of the tournament. We suggest that you don't waste any strokes.

#### **Registration Instructions:**

If you want to play in this year's tournament, call this year's director to get your name on the list. Telling someone else in the hopes they will remember to tell the director has not worked well in the past.

# 20th annual tournament is set for July

The 18th hole is a long par 5. However, if you need to get a par, plan to place your second shot just in front of the trash in front of the green. Don't try to go over it from too far back. From a distance, it looks innocent enough, how-

ever, when you get close to it, you will see Glenwood's version of "Never—Never Land." Whatever goes in there, never comes out.
