### his year, the 2014 Cruze Family Invitational Golf Tournament will be played at the River Oaks golf course.

The rules for the tournament are simple - in order to win, you have to be eligible, you have to sign up, you have to show up, and you have to have the lowest score.

Only a select few are eligible to play in this tournament. If you are one of the few who are direct descendants of Carl and Leona Cruze, (or are one of their spouses or children) you are invited to play in this year's Cruze Family Invitational Golf Tournament.

Signing up for the tournament is as easy as dialing a telephone and giving your name to the tournament director. Not calling the director is the only way you can miss the fun.

The tournament begins on Saturday and ends on Sunday. The best score from Sunday's game wins the tournament. However, if Sunday's game cannot be completed, then the best score from Saturday's game wins the tournament.

Although Saturday's game is not required, it's your chance to become familiar with the course, that is, find the traps, trees, water, blind shots, and observe the pin placements. It's also your chance to join in fun of the team competition.

There are no "gimmies" in this tournament and you can stop swinging only after your ball is in the cup.

The winner will be presented with a traveling trophy which will have their name engraved on it for all time and will receive a stylish cap with the tournament name and year on it.

A special feature of the tournament is that the player with the highest score gets to have their picture taken while presenting the trophy to the winner of the tournament. We suggest that you don't waste any strokes.

If you want to play in this year's tournament, call Greg at 320-249-2920 before July 5th to reserve your place. Telling someone else in the hopes they will remember to tell the director has not worked well in the past.

he twenty first annual **Cruze Family Invitational** Golf tournament is scheduled to be held the weekend of July 19th and 20th.

Note that this is the third weekend in July, not the **fourth** weekend, when we normally hold the tournament.

This year, the family golf tournament will be played at the River Oaks golf course in Cold Spring. The course is

We've played there before and it's still a challenge. There are precious few holes without either water or trees.

The winning score this year will likely be about 90. Jake had a remarkable "come from behind" win last year, but don't count on it happening for anyone on this course. This course will challenge you right through the 18th hole.

The 9th hole seems easy enough but a tee shot that comes up short will likely be wet. The temptation will be to hit the ball too hard, just to be sure that it makes it over the water. However, if you do hit it too hard you can easily drive it over the green and give yourself a difficult down hill chip.

Notice that most of the slope of this

green is from the middle to the front. If you drive it over the green, you will have to negotiate a "soft" downhill chip.



Then, if you get on in two, and if the pin is near the middle of the green, you could easily three putt. Staff writer

If you don't remember this hole, you will when you play it. The long hitters will find themselves in the "square" water hole, the slicers will find themselves testing the width of the creek on the right, and the hookers will find themselves apologizing for the broken windows.

It's a relatively easy par 5, <u>if</u> you play it short of the water, then short of the green with just enough distance for an easy chip to the green. Few will play the hole that way, so plan on picking up a stroke or two on this hole by playing it safe.
