26th annual tournament is set for July

he twenty sixth annual **Cruze Family Invitational** Golf tournament is scheduled to be held the weekend of July 28th and 29th.

This is one of the more challenging courses we've played. There only a few holes on this course where we can hit the ball as hard as we want.

The 6th hole will test your nerves. It's only a par 3, however, it's a peninsula green with a creek running in front and along the left, and then there's a small pond right behind the green. The safe shot here is to stay to the right and then hope for a good pitch to the pin, saving par.

The 11th hole and is a good example of where caution will generally save you a stroke. Hook it to the left on this one or slice it to the right and you'll lose 2 strokes to the field of players.

A prudent safe shot is about 125 yards into the center of the fairway. The fairway opens up a little around 125 yards. You won't gain a stroke on the field by playing safe, but you won't lose a stroke either.

Hole #13 is one of the few holes where the big hitters can show off. It's a long par 5 with a lot of trees on the right and out-of-bounds on the left. At least one of our players should be on (or near) the green in two. Depending on the pin placement, this could be a birdie hole. However, for the rest of us, a bogie (6) will be a decent score.

Get into trouble on this course and you could easily score over 100. The win-

ning score will probably be in the mid to high 80's.

Bring your "A" game.
