Pebble Creek is geared toward families and kids. Parts of the course are wide open, and parts of it are not. Water and trees will present problems for most of

While the course is par 72, the slope is rated around 130. For some perspective, a slope of 112 is an easy course, a slope of 120 is a hard course, a slope of 130 is a very hard course, and a slope of 140 is an insanely difficult course..

You will want to stay in the fairway on this course. Being anywhere else will cost you strokes. The winning score this year will be at least in the high 80's.

The course starts us out with a confidence builder on hole #1 (324 yrd par 4). That is, provided that we don't put ourselves in "tree jail." There aren't many trees on the right, but if we end up behind the trees, they're lined up in a way to make our next shot difficult.

The second hole is the most difficult hole (#1 handicap) on the course, it's a 369 yrd par 4. While it's a fairly straight, it's lined with a creek on the left and is heavily wooded on the right. You will need to stay in the fairway.

As always, have fun and don't let the course get to you.


